BACKGROUND:

On July 15, 2019 the Council accepted the proposed 2020 budget as presented.

In order to comply with submittal dates to the State and County, the Council is required to adopt a final budget for 2020.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

The estimated mill levy for the 2020 budget is 43.04 The final 2019 mill levy was 42.925

BACKGROUND:

Due to unanticipated weather events, the water table in the development rose to such an extent that bids to install water and sewer were significantly higher than the engineer's original estimate.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

The total revised costs for these improvements is \$268,000. The 2019 Project Funding will be updated to reflect the changes.

Bond Counsel reviewed the petitions and prepared the resolutions of advisability and approves them as to form.

RECOMMENDATION/ACTION:

- (b) The estimated or probable cost of the proposed Improvements is: \$67,000, exclusive of interest on financing and administrative and financing costs; said estimated cost to be increased at the pro rata rate of 1 percent per month from and after the date of adoption of this Resolution.
- (c) The extent of the improvement district (the "Improvement District") to be assessed for the cost of the Improvements is:

Carriage Crossing Addition

Lots 65 through 70, Block 5, Lots 11 through 12, Block 8, Lots 7 through 18, Block 9;

to the City of Maize, Sedgwick County, Kansas.

(d) The method of assessment is on a fractional basis as described below.

The lots and tracts in the Improvement District shall each pay 1/20 of the total cost of the improvement district.

In the event all or part of the lots or parcels in the proposed Improvement District are replatted before assessments have been levied, the assessments against the replatted area shall be recalculated on the basis of the method of assessment set forth herein. Where the ownership of a single lot is or may be divided into two or more parcels, the assessment to the lot so divided shall be assessed to each ownership or parcel on a square foot basis.

- (e) The apportionment of the cost of the Improvements between the Improvement District and the City-at-large is: 100% to be assessed against the Improvement District and 0% to be paid by the City-at-large.
- (f) Pursuant to Kan Const. Art. 5, § 12., K.S.A. 12-6a19 and Ordinance No. 938 of the City of Maize, the Improvement District shall be additionally assessed a benefit fee of \$7,340, to be assessed in the same manner as set forth in *Section 2(d)* hereof.
- **Section 3**. **Authorization of Improvements**. The abovesaid Improvements are hereby authorized and ordered to be made in accordance with the findings of the governing body of the City as set forth in *Section 2* of this Resolution.

Section 4. Bond Authority; Reimbursement. The Act provides for the costs of the Improvements, interest on interim financing and associated financing costs to be paid by the issuance of general obligation bonds or special obligation bonds of the City (the "Bonds"). The Bonds may be issued to reimburse expenditures made on or after the date which is 60 days before the date of adoption of the Prior Resolution, pursuant to Treasury Regulation 1.150-2.

Section 2. Findings of Advisability. The Governing Body hereby finds and determines that:

Carriage Crossing Addition

to the City of Maize, Sedgwick County, Kansas.

(d) The method of assessment is on a fractional basis as described below.

That the lots in Improvement District shall each pay 1/19 of the total cost payable by the improvement district.

In the event all or part of the lots or parcels in the proposed Improvement District are replatted before assessments have been levied, the assessments against the replatted area shall be recalculated on the basis of the method of assessment set forth herein. Where the ownership of a single lot is or may be divided into two or more parcels, the assessment to the lot so divided shall be assessed to each ownership or parcel on a square foot basis.

- (e) The apportionment of the cost of the Improvements between the Improvement District and the City-at-large is: 100% to be assessed against the Improvement District and 0% to be paid by the City-at-large.
- (f) Pursuant to Kan Const. Art. 5, § 12., K.S.A. 12-6a19 and Ordinance No. 938 of the City of Maize, the following lots, parcels, the Improvement District shall be additionally assessed a benefit fee of (\$15,746), to be assessed equally among all property equally per lot (19 lots).
- **Section 3**. **Authorization of Improvements**. The abovesaid Improvements are hereby authorized and ordered to be made in accordance with the findings of the governing body of the City as set forth in *Section 2* of this Resolution.

- **Section 4. Bond Authority; Reimbursement.** The Act provides for the costs of the Improvements, interest on interim financing and associated financing costs to be paid by the issuance of general obligation bonds or special obligation bonds of the City (the "Bonds"). The Bonds may be issued to reimburse expenditures made on or after the date which is 60 days before the date of adoption of the Prior Resolution, pursuant to Treasury Regulation 1.150-2.
- **Section 5**. **Effective Date**. This Resolution shall be effective upon adoption. This Resolution shall be published one time in the official City newspaper, and shall also be filed of record in the office of the Register of Deeds of Sedgwick County, Kansas.

On July 16, 2019, bids were received for Carriage Crossing water and sanitary sewer improvements.

Dutton Construction and Plumbing, LLC submitted the low total bid of \$219,488.

- \$51,278.00 for water distribution
- \$168,210.00 for sanitary sewer

The revised engineer's estimates are \$66,661 for water and \$200,710 for sanitary sewer (\$267,371 total).

The City Engineer has confirmed the bids.

A bid tabulation sheet is attached.

ITEM: Andale Construction, Inc. Contract: 45th Street Multi-use Sidewalk

BACKGROUND:

As part of the 2019 Budget, \$100,000 was provided in the CIP for the completion of a multi-use sidewalk on 45th Street west of Maize Road.

This project has been a city safety priority for a number of years.

Bids were requested at the beginning of 2019, with the lowest bid from Andale Construction, Inc. in the amount of \$136,740.

In anticipation of \$150,000 being planned for the multi-use path in the 2020 Budget, staff reached out to Andale Construction, Inc. for a new bid.

They replied that they would honor the original bid if we committed to beginning the project in 2019.

In consideration of the timing of the amphitheater project, more than enough funds exists within the total 2019 CIP budget to cover moving the project forward to take advantage of this offer.

For a point of reference, the sidewalk on the east side of Maize road along 45th St. was constructed by Andale Construction, Inc. for the contract amount of \$123,458.20 in 2016. The next closest bid in that 2016 project was more than \$20,000 above Andale Construction, Inc's bid.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

2020 CIP funds were adjusted to reflect moving this project ahead of schedule. Sufficient funds exist within the 2019 CIP to cover this adjustment.

RECOMMENDATION/ACTION:

- (d) Statutory Bond;

SECTION 13. Governing Law. The Contract and Contract Documents shall be governed by the laws of the State of Kansas.

SECTION 14. Miscellaneous Provisions. (a) If there is a conflict, the terms and conditions in the Standard Specifications shall prevail over terms and conditions of the Agreement.

- (b) No assignment by a party hereto of any rights under or interests in the Contract Documents will be binding on another party hereto without the written consent of the party sought to be bound; and specifically but without limitation, monies that may become due and monies that are due may not be assigned without such consent (except to the extent that the effect of this restriction may be limited by law), and unless specifically stated to the contrary in any written consent to an assignment, no assignment will release or discharge the assignor from any duty or responsibility under the Contract Documents.
- (c) The City and the Contract each bind itself, its partners, successors, assigns and legal representatives to the other party hereto, its partners, successors, assigns and legal representatives with respect to all covenants, agreements and obligations contained in the Contract Documents, (d) Where reference is made in this Agreement to a provision of the General Conditions or another Contract Document, the reference refers to that provision as amended or supplemented by other provisions of the Contract Documents.
